B. School Vision, Mission, Core Values



B. Other Important Notes:

 Apart from the summative assessments (once each in the first and second term), our school places great emphasis on students' daily learning. Therefore, each subject has formative assessments, and the results are incorporated into the overall subject score.

ii. Summative Assessment

a. For P.1– P.6, grades are shown on the report card.

A: 86-100

B: 70-85

C: 60-69

D: 40-59

E: 0-39

b. To reduce comparison and competition among students and to encourage self-improvement, all rankings for Primary 1 to 4 will not be shown on report cards, only the top 20 students in each grade will be displayed. For Primary 5 and 6, no rankings will be shown on the report cards.

- c. Distribution and Handling of Summative Assessment Papers
 - ♦ P.1- P.6 students will review the summative assessment papers and scores, and receive feedback in class.
 - Some of the summative assessment papers will be distributed to P.1-4 students, and parents are required to sign them. (The papers not distributed include Chinese Composition, Chinese Listening, English Listening, Chinese Speaking, English Speaking, Putonghua Listening and Putonghua Speaking.)
 - All P.5 and P.6 summative assessment papers will not be returned after being marked by teachers and reviewed with students. They will be kept at the school for Education Bureau inspection. If parents wish to inspect the papers, they may submit a written request to the school, specifying the subjects they wish to review. The school will then arrange a designated date and time for parents to inspect the papers according to the guidelines for paper inspections.

♦ Guidelines for P.5 & P.6 summative paper inspections are as follows:

- Only one parent or legal guardian is allowed to inspect the papers on the date and time designated by the school.
- ◆ The time for inspection is 20 minutes for each paper.
- ◆ Teaching assistants /duty teachers will distribute the papers after parents/legal guardians sign the attendance logbook.
- Parents or legal guardians must remain silent during the paper inspection to avoid disturbing other parents.
- Parents or legal guardians are not allowed to take photos, record videos, or use mobile phones during the paper inspection. They also must not write or mark anything on the assessment papers.
- ◆ If parents or legal guardians have any questions about the assessment questions or marking during the paper inspection, they may write their questions on the provided 'Concern Form' and hand it in along with the assessment papers to the duty teacher or teaching assistant after completing the inspection.
- ◆ The duty teacher/teaching assistant will not answer any questions regarding the summative assessment papers.

- ◆ The 'Concern Form' filled out by the parent or legal guardian will first be submitted to the class teacher, followed by follow-up actions from subject teachers and coordinators. Finally, the class teacher or subject teacher will contact the parent or legal guardian to provide a response. (The class teacher or subject teacher will contact the parent or legal guardian within seven school days.)
- ◆ Only Chinese (Reading), English (GE), Mathematics and General Studies assessment papers are open for inspection.
- ◆ The application period for exam paper inspection is within 2 weeks after the exam papers have been reviewed by teachers and students.
- ♦ For P.2, P.3, P.5 and P.6, the total exam scores only include Chinese, English, Mathematics, General Studies, Visual Arts and Music.
 - For P.1 and P.4 in the 2025-2026 academic year, the total exam scores only include Chinese, English, Mathematics, Visual Arts and Music.
 - # Since the Humanities and Science subjects are new for the 2025-2026 academic year their scores will not be included in the overall score, but the report card will show grades for these two subjects.
- → Teachers will read the summative assessment instructions and questions to P1 and P2 students only during the first term. In the second term, teachers will only read the summative assessment instructions to P2 students. For P3 to P6 students, teachers will neither read the summative assessment instructions nor the questions.
- → P5 (2nd term), P6 (1st and 2nd term) summative assessment results
 will be sent to the Education Bureau as a reference for secondary
 school places allocation purposes.

2. General Arrangements for Makeup Exams and Score Processing

If a student is absent during the examination period, a medical certificate or a written leave note stating the reason for the absence must be submitted. Only then will the school provide an opportunity for a makeup exam. If the student is unable to return to school within the specified time, no makeup exam will be offered (makeup exam period: four exam days and the two school days following the exam).

If the student remains absent during these six days (the four exam days and the two school days following the exam) and fails to return to school, no makeup exam will be arranged, and the report card will indicate 'Absent'.

3. Arrangements for Absentees in Formative Assessments, Exams or Subject-based Assessments

If a student is absent on the day of a formative assessment or dictation (including cross-boundary students), the subject teacher will arrange a makeup assessment or dictation within three school days.

If a student has not obtained any average marks throughout the term (including formative assessments, reading, writing, dictation, listening, or speaking), the subject teacher will arrange at least one formative assessment and one dictation as a make-up opportunity. However, the time available for revision and preparation will be relatively limited.

If the student remains absent and cannot return to school (including cross-border students), no opportunities for makeup assessments or dictations will be provided, and average marks will be calculated proportionally based on the summative assessment scores.

4. Homework policy

- i. To help parents better understand our school's homework policy, we have provided the relevant homework information and other important notes below. We kindly ask parents to pay close attention.
- ii. Homework is an indispensable part of 'learning,' and meaningful homework can significantly enhance the effectiveness of the learning process.
- iii. Homework generally refers to academic work assigned outside of class.
 - Therefore, homework should primarily be completed by the students themselves, with parents providing guidance if necessary.
- iv. The purpose of homework is to cultivate students' self-learning and self-discipline, while reinforcing the knowledge learned in class. Therefore, it is very important for students to complete their homework independently. Additionally, through the process of completing homework, students can develop their independence and autonomy, which is essential for equipping children to face future challenges.
 - v. To cater to diverse learning needs, homework is not limited to written assignments. Activities such as reading, pre-lesson study, searching for information, and watching documentaries are also considered forms of homework. Therefore, homework focuses on 'quality over quantity'. Mechanical copying exercises should not form the main part of homework tasks.
- vi. For students to have a healthy and balanced life, parents should not only plan sufficient time each day for completing homework but also allow students to engage in extracurricular activities or play.

2. Student Behaviour Management Policies

Our school puts a high priority on students' behaviour. All commendations, black marks and demerits will be shown on the Academic Report Card. Your supervision and cooperation with the school will be much appreciated. Details of the school rules are printed in student's handbook.

For further assistance or enquiries, please contact the class teacher during school hours.

3. Leave and Early Dismissal Procedures

Our school places great importance on students' attendance and leave matters

- i. If a student needs to take leave for a period due to an infectious disease, they must submit a medical certificate upon recovery, confirming that the student is fit to return to school.
- ii. If a student needs to take leave for more than two days for reasons other than illness, parents must bring supporting documents and apply for leave in person at the school.
- iii. If a student is absent due to illness or other reasons for more than 30% of the school days in a term, they will not be allowed to sit for the term examination. Parents should understand that prolonged absence may affect the student's academic performance. If the student performs poorly in the term examination, the school may recommend that the student repeat the year.

- iv. In general, the school does not accept absences due to travel. If parents insist on requesting leave for travel purposes, the school will record the leave accordingly, and it may affect the student's conduct grade.
- v. During the school year, the school will arrange various visiting activities for students and will notify parents in advance. If parents believe that their child cannot participate in a particular activity for special reasons, they should contact the class teacher first.
- vi. If a student is absent due to illness during the examination period, the school will arrange for the student to take a makeup exam within two school days after the examination. For P.6 students, their examination results are especially important. If they miss any subject exam, it may affect their secondary school allocation and graduation.

4. School Uniform and Appearance Guidelines

From the 2023-2024 school year, the school implemented a change of school uniform style. There is a three-year transition period for the replacement to the new school uniforms. Students may continue to wear the old uniforms, including PE uniforms and school coats from the school year of 2023-2024 to 2025-2026. The school's uniform supplier is "Victoria Uniform" and it will only provide the new school uniform styles for parents to purchase. For any enquiries about the new uniform styles, please call the school to contact Mr Au Yeung Kam Wa.

The school requires students to wear neat and clean uniforms each day. Parents may visit the school's designated uniform supplier, Victoria Uniform Company, to purchase uniforms that meet the specifications. We kindly ask parents to pay attention to the guidelines regarding the school uniform listed in the attachment.

Special Weather Conditions

When the temperature is 14 degrees Celsius or below, students are allowed to wear other coats over their uniforms. The colour of the coat should only be plain black, plain dark blue or plain dark green, and in a discreet style with no mixed colours or patterns. Girls can wear PE uniforms, instead of a school dress.

Student Appearance:

Hair Styles

Hair should be kept neat and tidy with no fancy or extreme styles worn.

Boys: a) Hair must be neat and tidy.

b) No dyeing, hair sprays, or hair gel is allowed.

Girls: a) Hair must be neat and tidy.

- b) No dyeing, hair sprays, or hair gel is allowed.
- c) Rubber bands, hair clips and head bands for girls should be simple and only be in plain black, plain dark blue, plain dark green or a plain white.

Accessories

Due to student safety reasons, students are not allowed to wear any unnecessary accessories. If accessories are required for religious reasons, prior written notification must be given to the class teacher, and approval must be obtained from the school.

7. Student Behaviour on School Buses

Reminders for Students Using School Buses/Public Transport:

Students SHOULD NOT:

- 1. Play with the emergency exit door.
- Speak to the driver once the bus has started moving.
- 3. Disturb the driver or other passengers.
- 4. Be rude to the driver or school bus attendant.
- 5. Place any part of their body outside the window.
- 6. Get on or off the vehicle before it has come to a complete stop.
- 7. Eat or drink.
- 8. Stand up or otherwise move around.
- Litter.
- 10. Use mobile phones, listen to music or play games.
- 11. Talk loudly.

Students SHOULD:

- 1. Board or leave in an orderly manner.
- 2. Follow the driver's and school bus attendant's instructions.
- 3. Respect the driver, school bus attendant and other passengers.
- 4. Sit properly all the time.
- 5. Keep quiet.
- 6. Be polite to the driver and school bus attendant.

8. Lunch Arrangement (See School Notice No. 3 for details.)

School lunch time: Monday to Thursday, 12:40 p.m. - 1:35 p.m.

Parents should choose one of the three lunch arrangements for their children.

- (A) Order lunch boxes from "Uncle Bento", the lunch supplier, through the "Uncle Bento by HKT" mobile APP.
- (B) Parents deliver lunch to school:

If parents choose to deliver lunch to school, they must enter through the main entrance between 12:00 and 12:30, and place the lunch bags labeled with the student's name and class into the designated collection box. The lunches will then be delivered to each class by our janitor.

(C) Students bring their own lunch:Students who bring their own lunch boxes must ensure they are properly packed and stored, and kept clean.

9. Arrangements for Classes and After-School Activities in Inclement Weather

According to the guidelines of the Education Bureau, contingency measures under adverse weather made by the school are as follows:

- i. If the weather is adverse on a school day, the Education Bureau will issue an announcement at 6:15 a.m. on the same day, instructing whether schools will be closed on that day. Parents can obtain information about the suspension arrangements on TV, radio, or the website of the Education Bureau.
- ii. In case of special circumstances, the Education Bureau may announce the suspension of schools in one or more regions. Students living in these areas do not need to return to school even if they study in a school in another area. (Our school belongs to Tuen Mun District.)

iii. When adverse weather warning signals are issued during class or when the class is about to start, the following measures apply:

Students who take the school bus will get on the school bus when it is safe to do so. Arrival times may be slightly delayed. If the road conditions are not permitted, the nanny will contact the parents to pick them up at the school. Parents are advised to keep in touch with the school bus company for the latest arrangements.

- iv. If necessary, text messages about the corresponding measures under adverse weather will be sent to parents via the E-class Apps.
- v. Under the influence of inclement weather, although the weather conditions may not cause the Education Bureau to announce the closure of all schools in Hong Kong, parents may decide whether to send their children to school based on the weather and traffic conditions in their residential area. Late arrivals or absences will be handled at the school's discretion in exceptional circumstances.

10. Healthy Snack Guidelines

With reference to the "Nutritional Guidelines on Snacks for Students" issued by the Department of Health of Hong Kong and the recommendations of the World Health Organization, this guideline aims to help students achieve caloric balance, increase fruit and vegetable intake, and reduce fat, sugar and salt intake.

1. Guiding Purposes

School is a key place for students to learn and grow, and healthy eating habits are essential for students' physical and mental development. The purpose of this guide is to:

- Promote Healthy Eating: Encourage students to choose healthy snacks that are low in fat, sugar and salt, and develop good eating habits to prevent obesity and chronic diseases (such as heart disease and diabetes).
- Snack portion control: Regulate the amount of snacks and drinks brought by students to avoid excessive calorie intake and ensure that it does not affect the appetite of the main meal.
- Creating a Healthy Eating Environment: Through the collaboration of schools, parents and staff, we create a healthy eating environment for students and educate them to make informed dietary choices.
- Step by step: Starting from controlling the amount of snacks and gradually promoting a healthy snack culture, we will improve the school eating environment in the long run.

2. Portion size requirements

In order to avoid excessive caloric intake and affect the appetite of the main meal, the following serving limits should be observed for snacks and drinks brought by students:

Snack Size:

- (a) Calories per serving should not exceed 125 kcal (about 525 kJ).
- (b) Sugar, potato chips and other high-sugar and high-fat snacks should not exceed **55 grams**.
- (c) Other snacks (e.g. bread, fruits, nuts, etc.) should refer to the following recommended serving sizes:
- (d) Bread: 1 slice of whole wheat bread (about 30 grams) or 1 slice of toast coated with 1.5 teaspoons of non-candy sauce.
- (e) Fruits: 1/2 bowl of diced fruit (about 100g) or 1 tablespoon of dried grapes (about 15g).
- (f) Nuts: 2 tablespoons plain dry roasted nuts (about 20 grams).

Drink Size:

- (a) Except for water, the serving size of all beverages (e.g. milk, juice, soy milk, etc.) should not exceed **250ml**.
- (b) Encourage students to drink only water outside of meals and snack breaks to reduce unnecessary sugar intake.
- (c) Should not bring glass bottles or aluminum cans for drinks back to school.

3. Food Arrangements for Festivals and Events

Festival activities (like the Mid-Autumn Festival and New Year) often involve high-fat and high-sugar traditional foods (like mooncakes and chocolates). To balance cultural significance with healthy eating, schools should prioritize providing healthy snacks.

H. Reading Activities

1. Library Hours

On school days (7:30a.m. to 7:55a.m.), the library is fully open, and students can choose to go to the library to borrow books. Additionally, at least twice a month, teachers lead students to the library to borrow books.

2. Library Rules

- A. Borrowing and Returning Library Books
 - Each student can borrow library books.
 - ii. Library books can be taken out for 1 week.
 - iii. Borrowers should return their books on or before the due dates.

B. Overdue Books

i. An overdue notice will be sent to the borrower if the book is overdue. If there is no response to the notice, students will not be allowed to borrow books.

C. Loss or Damage to Library Books

- i. Lost library books must be reported to the librarian.
- ii. Students will be held responsible for any lost or damaged library books and must pay the total cost of replacing the book.

3. Reading Scheme

i. Parent-Child Reading Scheme

- Progress is recorded in the reading record book.
- > Students record information about the five books they have read and parents sign the record to show that their children have read the books. (Score 1 point)
- Parents may read with their children and do the worksheets together. (Score 1 point)

ii. Star Award Reading Scheme

Students able to read the following numbers of books will receive a commemorative certificate from the school.

Gold: An outstanding reader who reads 60 books or more

Silver: A great reader reads 40 books or more

Bronze: A very good reader who reads 20 books or more

4. Pre-class reading

On Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday (8:20a.m. to 8:35a.m.), there will be a reading period. Students should bring their own books to read in the classroom.
